



DISPENSER INSTALLATION GUIDE


ANCHOR & SCREW METHOD

These three holes will provide enough support

- 1) Shower dispensers can be securely mounted to your surface with anchors & screws. Use a #8 plastic anchor plug (1" long) and stainless steel or brass #8 screws.
- 2) Some customers use 1/4" nylon spacers between the back of the dispenser bracket and their tile to provide room to get behind the bracket with cleaning products or a power washer. Use a drop of glue to hold the nylon spacer to the back of the bracket when screwing the dispenser into the wall.
- 3) If mounting your dispenser on a glass surface or mirror, we recommend using our double-sided tape mounting method instead of the anchor & screw method (see separate installation guide).
- 4) Remove bottles from the dispenser and make sure your mounting surface is clean & dry before starting your installation.
- 5) When mounting your dispenser, you'll need to utilize the specific holes in back of the bracket that are highlighted in the pictures to the left for your dispenser size (single, double or triple).
- 6) Determine the exact height that you would like the dispenser to hang. If installing more than one unit, check to see that you can install all dispensers at a uniform height. Be sure to double check that there are no shower heads in the way of your installation locations.
- 7) For installation on tile surfaces, align the top holes of the dispenser bracket with a horizontal grout seam. Slide the dispenser in either direction along that horizontal seam until the bottom hole is aligned with a vertical grout seam. Mark your selected position for holes and set your plastic anchors into the wall.
- 8) Make sure each anchor is inserted all the way into the wall and its end is flush with the surface. If necessary, you may cut the anchor tip to allow complete insertion into the wall.
- 9) Screw your dispenser bracket onto the wall. Then fill your bottles with bulk liquid product provided by ReadyCare and insert them into your dispenser.









DISPENSER CLEANING & MAINTENANCE SUGGESTIONS

- All dispenser bottles are flame-treated and silk-screened with special ink to maintain their original color for years in wet shower conditions.
- Dispensers should only be cleaned with soap and water. If you use a steam cleaner or other chemicals to clean your shower area, we recommend covering your dispenser bottles to keep them from being exposed to harsh chemicals.
- We suggest that you completely wash out your dispenser bottles at least once every two months. The bottles easily pop out of the brackets so that they can be cleaned. Soap and shampoo bottles do not need to be cleaned as often as lotion and conditioner bottles.
- Many customers choose to purchase a matching set of spare bottles and do a complete switch out once every two months. They thoroughly wash the old bottles and are ready for their next switch in two months.
- The pump tops are very durable and should last six months to a year. To keep your pump tops working properly, they should be cleaned two or three times per month by simply pumping warm water through them.
- Spray dispensers requires a little more routine maintenance than pump tops. The sprayer top should be wiped down daily with a warm towel as hair spray is a sticky substance and can clog the sprayer if not cleaned regularly.
- Once a month, we suggest you either replace the sprayer top with a new one or unscrew the sprayer and pump warm water through it. If the sprayers are not spraying a fine mist all the time, then you need to be cleaning or replacing them more often. Your spray coils should be replaced every six months.
- Dispenser brackets should also be cleaned regularly to prevent residue build up and the best time to do this is when you're exchanging bottles.
- Overall, a regular maintenance program will increase the life of your dispensers and give your members & guests a more pleasant experience in your locker room.
